

MOLES SEEDS

Phlox

Cultural Leaflet: ZZ295

Recently much breeding work has gone into this Summer bedding plant, which should rekindle interest in this traditional subject. Straightforward to produce.

Variety Selection

We offer both annual and perennial varieties of Phlox. A standard variety for bedding plant production, and higher quality products with double and starred blooms, as well as a variety which has won a Fleuroselect Gold Medal for its excellent garden performance. Phlox is an excellent pot bedding item for Spring and Summer sales.

Programming the Crop

Sow in February-early April for selling May-June.

Propagation and Growing-on

Sow the seeds (500-1,000 per gram) onto the surface of a free-draining, open, seed sowing compost, which should be thoroughly wetted with a suitable fungicide prior to sowing (to prevent damping-off diseases), and the trays allowed to drain.

Cover the seeds lightly with vermiculite, and cover trays with clear or milky polythene to maintain humidity, until the first seedlings are visible. Germination takes two to three weeks at 15°C to a maximum of 18°C. Keep the germinating seedlings moist at all times, without overwatering, and grow on at 15-18°C.

After about five weeks, move the plants into the sales container, generally a 6 or 9-pack containing a standard bedding plant compost. Grow on at 15-18°C, reducing the temperature gradually to around 10°C prior to sale.

Pest and Disease

Maintain good air movement through the crop, and water in the morning rather than the evening to keep the foliage dry and lessen attack by Botrytis. Pay good attention to glasshouse hygiene, using only fresh trays, pots, compost, water and clean bench tops to avoid damping-off diseases, and check for the presence of pests such as aphids and whitefly, spraying accordingly.
